


# What have we been up to in February?

Later in the afternoon, we went to the Home Office where Cecilie was lending her victim's voice to an awareness video regarding financial fraud for deeper understanding with those who deal with victims.



We were honoured to be invited to New Scotland Yard to have a meeting with a passionate team of Fraud detectives who work in the Met Police.

Many of us, through our own experiences have difficult memories of the way we were treated but I can't stress enough how much is changing in this area and how dedicated these and other officers are to the cause. Our crimes in particular, are very complex and filled with difficulties but when there is a line of enquiry for them to get hooked onto, this force is on it.

There is a long way to go with some forces who cannot get their heads around in person romance fraud not being a 'civil' matter because they refuse to look at the intent behind the relationship being created in the first place. We'll keep pushing!

The build up to Valentine's day was a bit of a frenzy that we hadn't anticipated. The amount of awareness being raised in the media is amazing and long overdue. By Monday evening we had talked to around 10 media outlets, in which they asked for advice or thoughts around the current landscape of this fraud. Stopping the stigma around this so important and we talked a lot about the language they could use to help with this.
